# Introduction

## Maersk Aptitude Test

When your application has been received, and you have been accepted to the next stage of the Maersk hiring process, you will be asked to participate in the Maersk online assessments. There are two separate tests that you will have to pass in order to continue the recruitment process. These Maersk psychometric tests are provided by PLI, a psychometric testing company. We will outline each of these tests below.

### 1. Maersk PLI Test

In the Maersk PLI test you will be given 12 minutes to answer 50 questions. There is a mixture of verbal, numerical, and diagrammatical reasoning questions. You will need to work quickly and carefully at the same time. Often this is seen as an impossibility, however, using this study pack, you can see what to expect. With correct practice and application, every single one of the 50 questions can be answered within the allotted time.

### 2. Maersk Personality Test

Once you have completed the Maersk aptitude test you will have to take the Maersk personality test, the Maersk PI, (predictive index). Sometimes, you will receive the two invitations at once. This test isn't timed and you are expected to take your time over the completion of the test. You are an array of words to describe yourself and also what people think of you. All you need to do is tick which of those words best describe you.

The two assessments are not difficult, but you may be caught out of time if you are not adequately prepared.

## Maersk Telephone Interview

If you have completed these tests to the satisfaction of Maersk you will be invited to take part in a telephone interview. This is the first of a number of different interviews that will be conducted in the Maersk recruitment process. This interview will be held with a member of the HR team and will be based on your personal skills and capabilities.

While answering these questions it is important to keep in mind all the competencies of Maersk and incorporate them into your answers.

Some questions that you may expect in the Maersk telephone interview are:

- What types of people do you work with best?
- How do you cope with working with friends, whilst maintaining a professional approach?
- Are you able to work independently?

As well as these questions you will receive feedback on the Maersk online tests that you have taken. Knowing how to answer questions at the Maersk telephone interview is a challenge as you have to show not only that you have the requisite skills that Maersk require but also show motivation and willingness to learn and grow. ## The Maersk Second Interview

If you do well enough on the first interview, you will be invited to a Maersk office for a further is a close examination of your particular skills and how they relate to the position you want. interview. Moreover, as there will be a number of different members of this interview team they want to get to know you as well. ## PI Learning Indicator Sample Questions

This is a sample of the types of questions that are used on **PI Learning Indicator™**. These examples are provided to help you become familiar with the format and types of questions on the PI Learning Indicator.

While the actual PI Learning Indicator assessment consists of 50 questions with a 12-minute time limit, this example set only consists of 20 questions. If you wish to simulate the time constraints of the actual PI Learning Indicator, we suggest that you try to respond to these 20 questions in five minutes without any interruptions or distractions. Note that five minutes is not a long time for answering 20 questions, and that is why it is important that you work quickly. It may be very difficult to respond to all 20 questions within five minutes, but that is okay—respondents typically do not answer all 50 questions on the PI Learning Indicator either.

On the actual PI Learning Indicator (shown below), there will be five questions on each screen page. The time remaining will be displayed in the top right corner of the screen, and the “Previous” and “Next” page buttons are located on the bottom. Calculators are not permitted, and you must complete the assessment without the help of others.
